



# **Descendants by Books**

## **OVERVIEW - FAMILY GROUP BOOKS AND BIOGRAPHIES**

The first part of this genealogy consists of eight “books” each of which covers a particular segment of the descendants of John Peter Horn that are identified in this genealogy. The chart following “Notes” depicts how these books inter-relate to form the complete coverage of these descendants. Note that when a dashed line crosses through a name, that person is covered in two books. Following Section 12.0, Book 8, is the Master Index of all the descendants, listing each one by name and the book and page where that person’s name can be found.

Each book contains information about several generations of the family – birth, christening, marriage, death and burial – presented in narrative form. Books can be organized in either of two formats – Ahnentafel, which starts with an individual and lists his or her ancestors, or Modified Register, which starts with an individual and lists his or her descendants, grouped by generation. This genealogy uses the Modified Register format.

Following each book are biographies for many of the individuals covered by that book. Pictures and excerpts from published articles, etc., are included where available.

Wherever possible, the town, county and state have been noted for any geographical location to avoid confusion. In the case of Allentown, Pa., there could be some confusion. Present day Allentown was known as Northampton Town from its founding in 1762 until 1838, and was located between 4<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> streets, and Union and Liberty streets. Adjacent areas were considered as Salisbury Township. In this volume, whatever name was used in the source material is used, with the appropriate explanation

## NOTES ON NUMBERING SYSTEMS AND TERMINOLOGY

The charts and reports in this first part have been derived from the Personal Ancestor File program PAF 5.2.18 developed by the Church of the Latter Day Saints, well respected in the genealogy community. All of the data on individuals has been digitized using their programs, and two types of reports have been prepared. The first type “Descendants of John Peter Horn”, section 3.3, lists everyone (over 500 names in all, spanning ten generations). The second type “Descendants by Books”, section 4, breaks down the list into eight groups, and greatly expand the information on each member of that group. PAF calls these reports “Modified Registers”; here they are called “Books.

There are a variety of numbering systems used in the Modified Register format, designed to help the reader identify an individual’s relationship to others in the family group.

For example:        9 F i **Jane DOE** – 101 (John Doe, Jonathan Doe)

The number “9” indicates the sequential order of the named individual in the family group covered by that particular book. The starting individual in each book is assigned number 1. Beginning with the first child of number 1, individuals are numbered sequentially. (spouses are not assigned numbers). Therefore, Jane Doe is the ninth individual in that family group.

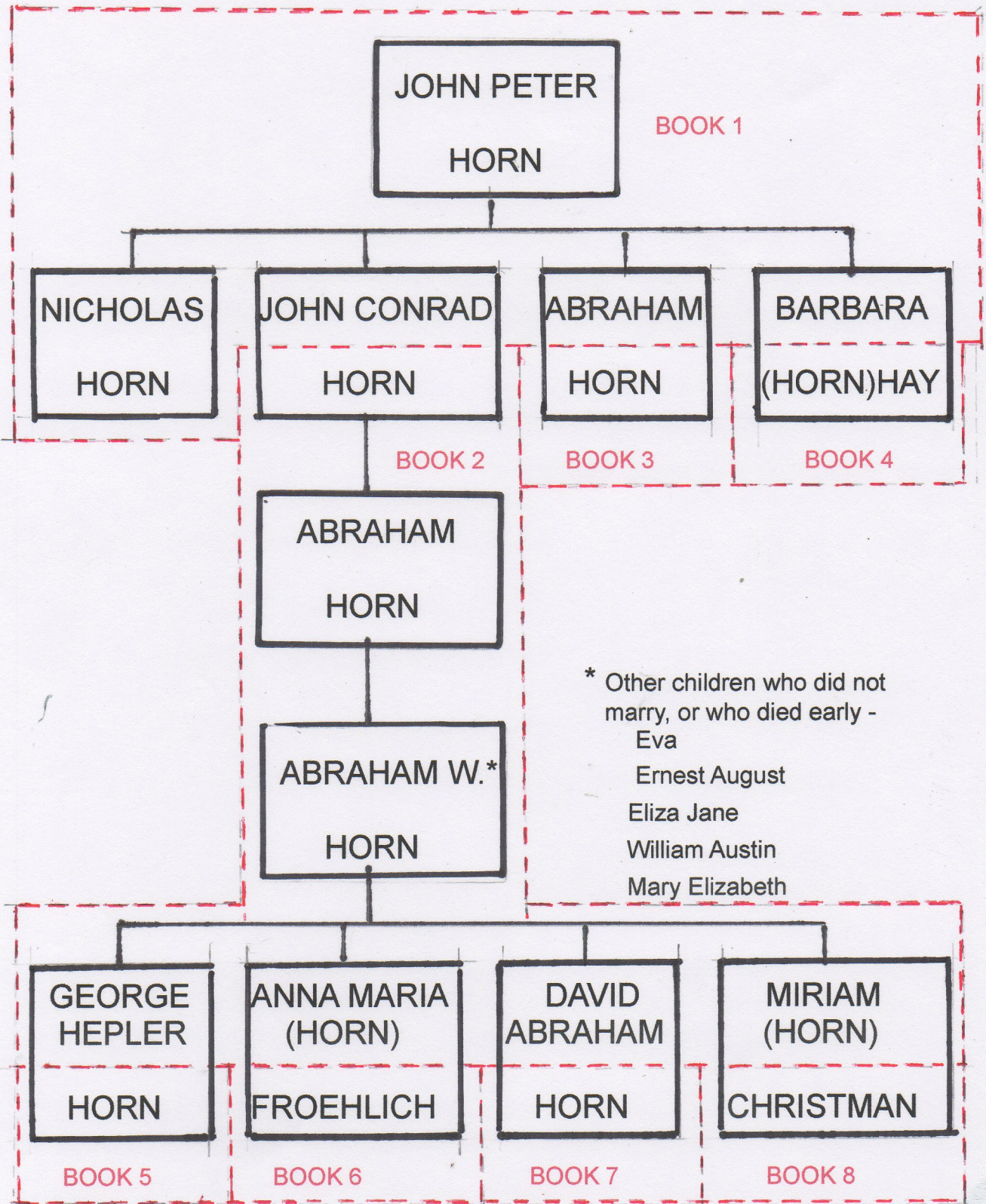
Next is the letter “F”, indicating that this individual is a female.

Next is a small roman numeral “i”, indicating that Jane is the first child of the parents that are listed preceding her.

Next is the number “101”, which is the RIN (Record Identification Number). The program assigns each individual a RIN. This number is used to distinguish that individual from all others in the genealogy.

Finally, the names John Doe and Jonathan Doe, identify the lineage of Jane as the daughter of John, and the granddaughter of Jonathan, his father.

The program also assigns a MRIN (Marriage Record Identification Number) to each marriage. This number serves no purpose in this genealogy and has been edited out of these reports.
