Mr. and Mrs. Fred Panzenhagen are a happy couple. They laugh together, have an army of friends and talk with pride about their four college-educated children, 10 grandchildren and 5 great-grandchildren.

They've been a happy couple for 65 years, sharing a wedded life that began on a prairie farm near Taunton, Minn. he's 89, she's 84.

The Panzenhagens are spending Thanksgiving in Phoenix with a granddaughter and her family. Their plane tickets were anniversary gifts from their children.

Before they left, they sat in the living room of their apartment in the Foley Building at Lincoln Manor, talking about their past and the things they have to be thankful for.

"We are thankful God has taken care of us and our family — our children, our grandchildren, our great-grandchildren," Mrs. Panzenhagen said. "God has been with us all the way, leading us on."

Mrs. Panzenhagen, the former Ruth Froelich, tells about their wedding day, Nov. 16, 1910.

"It was sunny and snowy, a mixed-up day. There were a lot of preparations before the wedding took place in the Froelich home in Yellow Medicine County, not far from the South Dakota border. The Froelichs butchered a calf. Panzenhagen's family provided a large ham, Ruth and a girl friend cleaned 20 chickens.

"We had, I think, 20 cakes," Mrs. Panzenhagen recalled.

100 guests attend

About 100 guests came and danced until 4 a.m. in a large shed in which a floor and stove were installed after the threshing machine was removed.

Recalling their dating days, Panzenhagen turned to his wife and said, "I don't think many boys would do what I did to see you — walk two miles and a half."

Panzenhagen proposed in a buggy. Mrs. Panzenhagen told about that.

"Neighbors and friends would go to each other's homes. We had different games we played. The buggies were sitting around the yard. We got tired of playing, so we sat in the buggy. That's when he proposed."

The couple had been seeing each other about a year and were engaged two years before they were married.

"In those days, we saw each other only every two weeks or three," Mrs. Panzenhagen said.

Mrs. Panzenhagen still has her wedding dress. In fact, she wore it four times during the week before their 65th anniversary when friends and family held events to honor them.

Pair has 4 children

The couple has four children. All, at one time or another, were teachers. The oldest, Norman, is a retired school superintendent living in Cadott, Wis.; Ruth (Mrs. Norman Graham) lives in Asheville, N.C., and is a meteorological technician; Dorothea (Mrs. Gary Tostrud) 3112 Southwood Drive, is a former librarian active in volunteer work, and Fred Jr. is a research engineer in North Palm Beach, Fla.

Before the couple was married, Panzenhagen lived on a farm with his parents. They had moved there from Onawa, Iowa.

Panzenhagen went to a school in town. Mrs. Panzenhagen attended a country school where precautions were taken against prairie fires.

"It was all prairie," she recalled. "They would plow some furrows around the school, leave a space and plow again so if a fire came, you'd start a fire toward it. We were there once when the whole thing burned except us."

When the Panzenhagens married, both sets of parents left the farms, leaving the young couple to run 240 acres.

But Panzenhagen preferred mechanical work and less than two years later the couple moved to Minneapolis where Panzenhagen worked in a furniture factory and attended auto mechanic school at night.

They lived in Minneapolis three years before

moving to Cumberland, Wis., where Panzenhagen was a foreman in a garage. Fords were the easiest cars to work on, he said.

"I wanted to make a \$25 bet with another man that I could assemble the whole motor blindfolded. He wouldn't take me up."

The Panzenhagens were living in Cumberland during World War I. Panzenhagen said he was a year too old to be drafted, but served in the State Guard.

Mrs. Panzenhagen recalled Armistice Day. "That's something you can't forget. He called me up and said 'The war is over.' That's when the flu was so bad and it was raining and bad weather, but everybody was out. There was a big bonfire that night.

Panzenhagen added, "One guy kneeled by the bonfire and kissed the flag."

The couple also lived in Turtle Lake, Wis., before moving to Superior where Panzenhagen worked in the shipyard during World War II. He was a steamfitter on Liberty ships.

The couple moved to Racine in 1945 and Panzenhagen got a job with the J.I. Case Co.

"I worked for Case until I was 71," Panzenhagen said.

Panzenhagen bears a resemblance to the late Harry S. Truman.

"We were getting on a train," Mrs. Panzenhagen said, "Right on the steps someone asked if he was Harry Truman."

Incident recalled

Panzenhagen recalled another incident when the couple had stopped in Independence, Mo., to see Truman's home.

"There was another car from Michigan. They thought I was Harry."

Panzenhagen said the first presidential candidate he voted for was Theodore Roosevelt.

"When he ran against Taft."

That was 1912 when Taft was the president and Woodrow Wilson was elected.

"I remember a parade when McKinley and Hobart ran for president (1896)," he added.

"That was in Iowa. Saw William Jennings Bryan there too."

The Panzenhagens sold their home at 2828 Arthur Ave. earlier this year and moved into their apartment.

"We love our place here in Lincoln Manor," said Mrs. Panzenhagen, who occupies her time crocheting.

She has given up sewing although she used to make most of her own clothes and some for her children and grandchildren.

But she continues to correspond regularly with her out-of-town children, writing three and four-page letters weekly.

Panzenhagen no longer plays the accordion as he did for country dances when he was a young man. And lately he hasn't painted, an activity he started when the Panzenhagens lived in Turtle Lake.

Never had a lesson

His daughter, Ruth, noted, "Once a traveling artist came through. Dad decided he could do as well. He never had a lesson, but he bought some tubes of oil and started painting. He took one night class in Racine."

Baseball is one of Panzenhagen's chief interests and he is often seen listening to one game on the radio and watching another on television.

He said he has no favorite team, but enjoys seeing the Chicago Cubs lose.

Mrs. Panzenhagen said she likes to see the Cubs win.

If that's typical of the major disagreements, it's no wonder the couple is so happy together.

Panzenhagen said if he were asked to give advice to newlyweds, he'd say, "Love each other and not fight. Straighten out arguments without fighting. We never did fight."

Mrs. Panzenhagen added, "Trust in God and do what is right. Always forgive and forget."

The Panzenhagens left last Thursday for a two-week stay in Arizona. The flight from O'Hare Field to Phoenix took 2½ hours, only an hour longer than Panzenhagen's horse and buggy trip to Canby, Minn., in 1910 to get the wedding license.

Gerhard Tostrud #111

Gerhard Tostrud, Music Teacher, Dies

Longtime Racine music teacher Gerhard Tostrud died today. He was 60.

Tostrud, who lived at 3112 Southwood Drive, taught music in Racine elementary and junior high schools for 28 years.

Tostrud had been assigned to teach this year at Johnson, Dr. Jones, and Hansche elementary schools. Previous assignments included Mitchell elementary and junior high schools.

Tostrud came to Mitchell School in 1945 after teaching at Benton, Wis., and Superior, Wis. He was a 1936 graduate of River Falls State Teachers College and a 1939 graduate of the Birmingham Conservatory of Music, Birmingham, Ala.

Tostrud had conducted the Racine Kiwanis Youth Symphony and had played in symphony orchestras in Duluth, Minn., Superior, Birmingham, and Racine.

He is survived by his wife, Dorothea, and three daughters, Joyce Wotruba, of Plover, Wis., Gail Frieberg, of Phoenix, Ariz., and

Mr. Tostrud passed away early Tuesday morning, October 2, 1973 at the age of 60 years. He was born in Fland, Wisconsin on December 10, 1912. He was a graduate of River Falls State Teachers College and the Birmingham Conservatory of Music. Mr. Tostrud taught Instrumental Music in Superior, Wisconsin as well as in Racine, Wis. He played in the Duluth, Superior, Birmingham and Racine Symphonies. He also conducted the Kiwanis Youth Symphony in Racine. He was active in the Big Brother Program, Lutheran Laymen League and Local Musical Organizations. He was also very active in work at the Trinity Lutheran Church and Holy Cross Lutheran Church. Surviving are his wife, Dorothea; three daughters and sons-in-law, Joyce and Edward Wotruba of Plover, Wis.; Gail and David Frieberg of Phoenix, Ariz.; Kathleen and Clement Imhoff of Atlanta, Ga.; three grandchildren; one sister, Mrs. Otto (Carol) Jacobsen of Rockford, Ill.
